- “Standard” - Highest vertical height / Normal retention
- “Standard Wide” - Highest vertical height / Greatest retention
- “Vertically Reduced” - Normal vertical height / Normal retention
- “Daytime” - Normal retention / Lowest vertical height

SCI Laboratory made Anterior Splint Range

SCI ¹ - Covers upper 2-2 Occluding on the lower 1-1 anterior teeth with complete disclusion element

Summary - Ideal for a primary clenching problem, contacting just the 1-1 lower incisors.



SCI ² - Covers upper 3-3 Occluding on the lower 2-2 with no canine interference

Summary - Ideal for patients who Clench and suffer bruxism. With the removal of canine contacts and posterior disclusion, it is thought that clenching is inhibited.



SCI ³ - Covers upper 3-3 Occluding on the lower 3-3

Summary - Can be used to simply protect dentition/restorations whilst giving the patient a stable platform to occlude against. Mainly for use at night but can be worn during daytime due to non-traumatic gentle bite planes.



FULL ARCH SPLINT (Michigan or Tanner)

Full arch directive splint with canine & anterior guidance limited to intra capsular TMJ disorders.
